Volunteer Positions



Route Marshall – our most crucial role!!!

Route Marshals are an integral part of the traffic management plan. Marshals are the eyes and ears out on the route - an operational must for the ride. Route Marshals keep the cyclists heading in the right direction, warn them of hazards and generally support them on the ride.

Route Marshall volunteers are also typically required to start anywhere from 5am – 9am (dependant on location of position), and will conclude anywhere from 9.00am – 2.30pm (again dependant on location), positions are located all along the cycle route (we will aim to place you in a position close to your place of residence where possible).

Merchandise

The merchandise team help distribute the event T-shirts and other merchandise to the riders, after they complete the ride.

Merchandise volunteers are also typically required from 8am – 1pm, and all positions will be located at the finish site at Southport, Gold Coast.

Rest Stop

Rest Stop volunteers would typically be performing tasks such as:

- Set up/Pack down of rest stops
- Distribute the food and drinks to the riders OR assist in crowd control management keeping access ways clear and directing riders
- Keep the rest stop clean and tidy throughout the event

Rest Stop volunteers are also typically required from 5am – 11am and will be located at Rest Stop 1 (at Eagleby).

Transport Assistant

Transport Assistant volunteers would typically be performing tasks such as:

- Issue tickets to riders for bus seats
- Fielding queries on transport

Transport Assistant volunteers are also typically required from 8am – 2pm (dependant on position), and all positions will be located at Southport, Gold Coast.

Bike Loaders

Bike Loader volunteers would typically be performing tasks such as:

- Pack bikes into trucks
- Assistance with other manual work

Bike Loader volunteers would need to be physically fit and able to participate in manual work – including loading trucks and lifting bikes (with care). These volunteers are typically required from 10am – 3pm.
